



# PhotoVoice.



In July 2024, the West Yorkshire Violence Reduction Partnership (VRP) launched its Child First Framework which was co-produced with 455 children across West Yorkshire.

Leeds Youth Service played a huge role in creating the framework, with over 100 children and young people taking part in the co-production sessions. We are keen to make sure that the Child First Framework is embedded into all our work.

The 2024 UK Youth Parliament Make Your Mark report indicated that the main concern for children and young people in Leeds was Crime and Safety. With participation and empowerment being one of the key pillars of Leeds' vision for youth work, this gave us an exciting opportunity to try something new! We wanted to capture young people's views on safety in an innovative, fun and engaging way – and **PhotoVoice** was born!

All quotes used throughout this photo book are taken directly from the children and young people involved in the project.

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### **Foreword**

**PhotoVoice** is a creative research methodology that uses photography to gather the views of communities. To do this, James and his fantastic youth work team engaged with young people from six areas on this project, giving out disposable cameras and tasking them with taking photos that answered the following questions:

- 1. What makes you feel safe in your community?
- 2. What do people in your community think about young people?
- 3. What would you like people in your community to think about young people?

After taking the photos, Georgia from the VRP spent time with each group to explore the narrative behind their photos. Young people then worked with photographer Daniel Wheeler from Take It Easy Lab to design their exhibition and choose which photos to include.

Throughout this photo book you will see the photos selected by young people and the meaning behind them. Key themes emerging from the project include:

- The value of youth workers in young people's lives.
- The importance of physical safety features in communities.
- Availability of positive activities for young people.

These are just some of our reflections, but we would love to hear about your takeaways!

This project has been a fantastic experience, allowing us to try out new and creative ways to capture children and young people's views. We hope you enjoy this photo book and reflect on how we can all learn from their insights.

We would like to thank everyone who has helped make this project a reality, especially all the children and young people who chose to take part, and we're excited to see what comes next!

My name is Kav, and this is my story!





"Tons of people hang out at Alfie's bench."



"Family, here to support you."






